

In the context of the EU objective of ensuring territorial economic and social cohesion and balanced development across all EU regions, the treaties recognise special attention to territories with structural geographic and demographic handicaps such as island, mountain and rural areas. However, regional disparities are increasing and current support mechanisms do not fully take into account their specificities. The objective of the seminar will be to provide a better understanding of constraints faced by island, mountain and rural areas and will seek to put forward recommendations for future EU policies to improve the state of cohesion in these areas.
