Following the positive outcome of the referendum on Croatia's accession to the EU, Cllr. Mrs Linda Gillham, Member of Runnymede Borough Council and Co-President of the CoR-Croatia Joint Consultative Committee (JCC) and

CoR continued dialogue with EUROMED partners at 3rd ARLEM plenary session

On 30th of January in Bari, Italy, the Euro-Mediterranean Regional and Local Assembly (ARLEM) met in plenary to discuss the state of the territorial dimension in the Union for the Mediterranean.

Undoubtedly, members had a chance to debate over the current situation in the region following the Arab Spring.

The reports which have been dealt with in 2011 on water and desertification, the promotion of renewable energy, the role



of SMEs in local development, cultural heritage have been put to the vote before the ARLEM Plenary session

Mr. Francesco Musotto, EA member and deputy of the Sicilian Parliament, pointed out that it is extremely important to support our friends from the Southern shore of the Mediterranean in their democratic transition process. ARLEM, he added, could serve as an effective mean to enhance the level of cooperation and contacts while putting at the disposal of the Mediterranean members the expertise and experience of the CoR politicians and their local and regional authorities.

European Alliance group to hold meeting in Łubianka, Poland in May on *Renewable Energy – from Policy to Reality*

Renewable sources of energy – wind power, solar power (thermal, photovoltaic and concentrated), hydro-electric power, tidal power, geothermal energy and biomass – are essential alternatives to fossil fuels. Their use reduces our greenhouse gas emissions, diversifies our energy supply and reduces our dependence on unreliable and volatile fossil fuel markets (in particular oil and gas). The growth of renewable energy sources also stimulates employment creation across local and regional authorities in Europe.

Annual CoR / EA group Secondary School Competition is launched

The European Alliance group is organising its annual Secondary Schools competition during 2012, a competition which engages the young students to get involved in the European debate

In the two stage competition pupils will need to be successful in a multiple choice quiz on the European Union and the Committee of the Regions. The students will also write an essay on the European Year for Active Ageing.



The project starts end of January and finishes in May. Full members of the EA group will nominate the secondary schools from their region to participate in the competition. Two winners from each participating school will be awarded with a two days trip to Brussels, where they will meet members of the Committee of the Regions during the May 2012 plenary session, representatives of the European Commission and European Parliament, having the chance to discover Brussels, the capital city, its history and present.

ENVE Commission to visit during 2012 North Tipperary and Clare sustainable energy solutions

On the invitation of Clare County Councillor and EA member Brian Meaney, the ENVE commission will hold a study visit in April 2012 in North Tipperary and Clare, Ireland on Sustainable Energy and Enterprise Development Solutions in Rural Communities.

The study visit will concentrate on two unique projects in rural parts of Ireland. The first project, cofunded under the EU Commissions CONCERTO Programme, a unique eco-village has been developed (100% supplied by renewable heating system with the largest solar array in Ireland), 400 buildings have received significant energy upgrades, with energy savings of between 35-60%, up to 3.5MW biomass heating systems have been installed.

The second project, the Clare Wood Energy Project is an integrated project involving Local Development Companies, Local Authorities, Forestry



and Agricultural Advisors and Private Individuals. It has resulted in significant investment in biomass heating systems and also the development of a number of local wood fuel supply companies.

EDUC external meeting and conference to be held in Šiauliai in 2012



Mrs Daiva Matonienė's proposal to organise an external meeting and conference on "Sports for All – interregional cooperation" in Šiauliai, Lithuania has been adopted during the 10th meeting of EDUC commission in Sofia on the 28 September 2011. The proposed venue is a hotspot for Lithuanian sport and scene of the world's most important sport event, the 5th " Šiauliai 2012" TAFISA games which will take place at the same time as EDUC meeting.

Šiauliai is the fourth largest city in Lithuania. Situated in the north of the country the city dates back to the 13th century. Today Šiauliai is an important industrial and cultural centre also giving a significant amount of attention to sport and sports events.

The event will be aimed at encouraging grassroots' sport activities. As 2012 will be the European Year of active ageing and intergenerational solidarity citizens will be reminded that sports are indeed for everybody.
